### **EVENT DETAILS**

9th Annual 1883 Black Ice Pond Hockey Championship White Park in Concord, NH (at the intersection of White St. & Washington St.)

The 1883 Black Ice Pond Hockey Championship's mission is to maintain and expand ice skating opportunities locally, as well as, celebrate and honor the rich hockey heritage that has occurred in Concord, New Hampshire.

Acknowledging the history begins with the tournament name. "1883" refers to a historical date and "Black Ice" refers to the purest of ice. St. Paul's School, located in Concord, and hockey have been synonymous since November 17, 1883 when the school community gathered on the Lower Pond to witness the first organized game ever played in the United States.

Additional Info: Limited vendors will provide food and drink during the event. There will be a shuttle bus running during game times to multiple downtown restaurants. There will also be discounts and special promotions available for hockey players at these establishments.

Shuttle Service: To alleviate parking concerns at White Park and get players around Concord, there will be a complimentary shuttle bus that will run Friday and Saturday to and from White Park. On this route, the shuttle bus will also stop at many of the participating Downtown Concord Restaurants.
